Mapping Danville

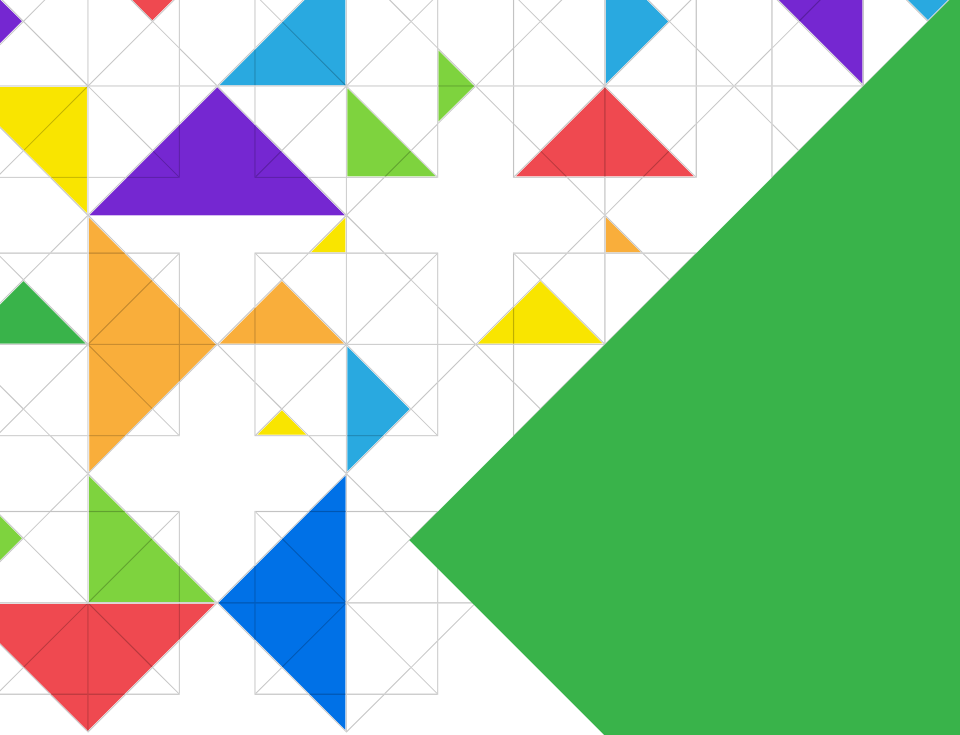
The Storefront Neighborhood Map / Online Place Your Pin exercise asks residents to identify their neighborhood center.



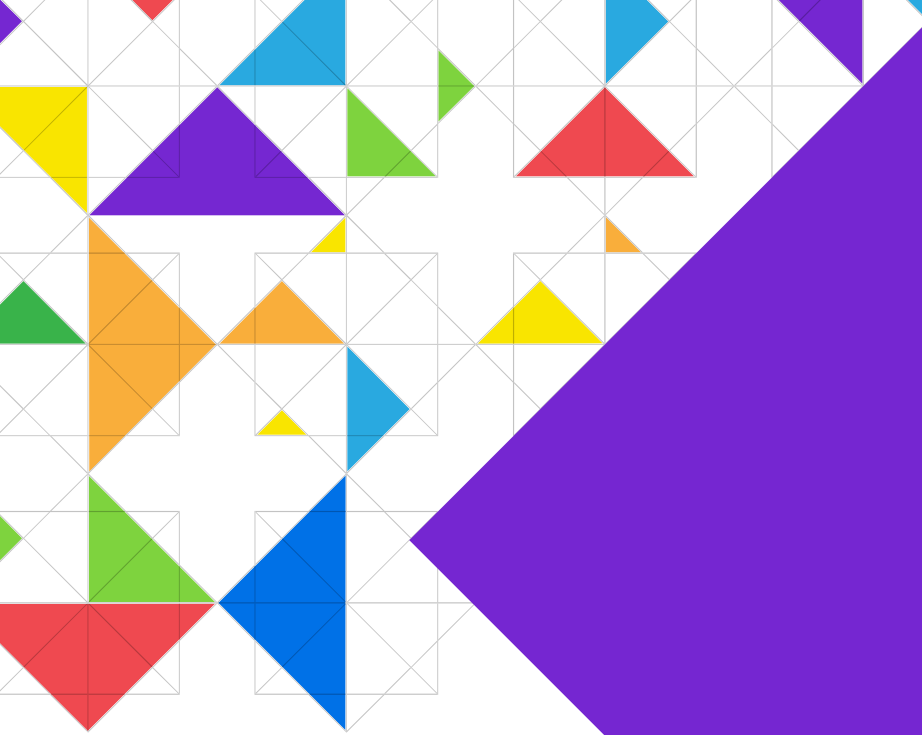

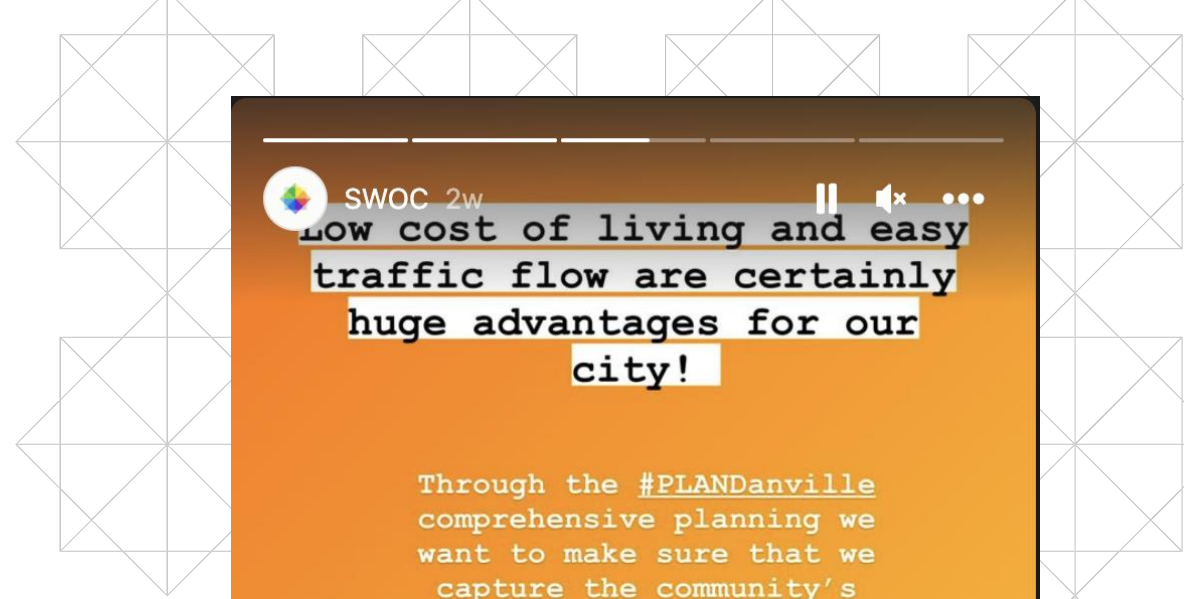
SWOC Danville's Strengths

Strengths

Via In-person Conversations

1. The **sense of community**, friendly people, and tight-knit families as seen in community events and partnerships.
2. Education-related themes **access to all grade level educational** opportunities.
3. The **growth and improvement** of schools, businesses, downtown, and the City as a whole were noted as strengths.
4. The river, natural resources, parks, Riverwalk trails, and **access to nature**.
5. **Faith and religion** were identified, instilling values, and providing love and support to families.



Danville's Top 9 Strengths

Danville is a community that **thrives on supporting local businesses** and boasts a growing downtown area with parks and outdoor recreation, while also fostering a strong sense of community engagement and a friendly atmosphere.

Engaged Community:

Strong sense of community, willingness to help others, and a friendly atmosphere.

Local Businesses:

Education:

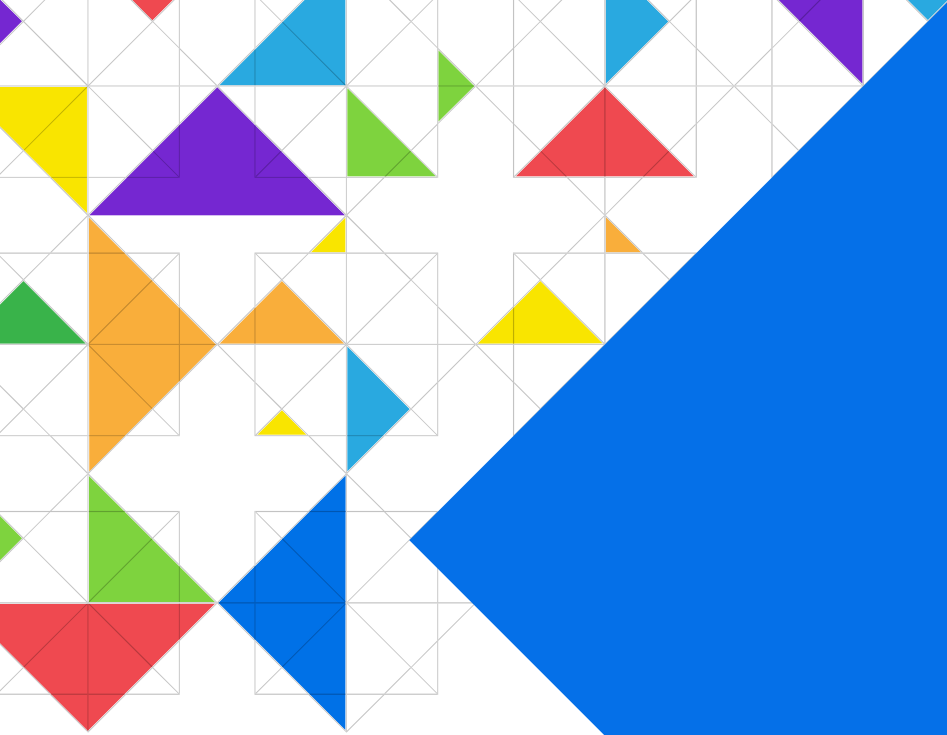
Educational opportunities at every grade level with a variety of learning styles and environments.

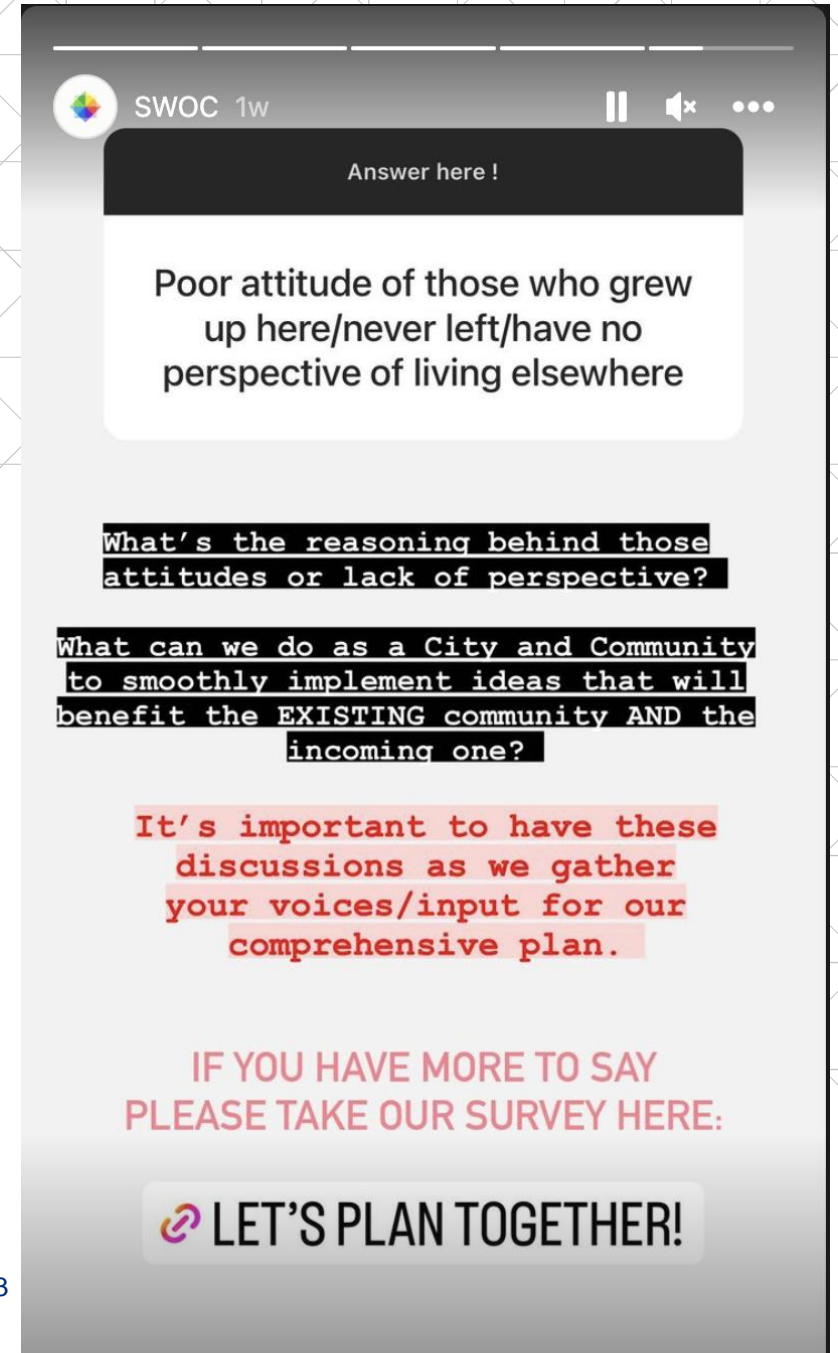
Danville's Weaknesses

Weaknesses can be areas of improvement, lack of certain resources, poor infrastructure, or any other internal factors that limit potential growth.

Weaknesses

Via Social Media Feedback

1. Danville faces a number of **economic challenges**, including **high poverty rates**, a declining population, and limited job opportunities.
2. The **education system** in Danville is **perceived to be weak**, with low graduation rates, low test scores, and inadequate funding.
3. **Access to healthcare** is a concern in Danville, with limited options for healthcare providers and high rates of chronic health issues.
4. Danville has a **higher crime rate** compared to other cities of similar size, with a high incidence of property crime and violent crime.
5. The **infrastructure** in Danville has been **described as inadequate**, with concerns about the condition of roads, bridges, and other public works.



Weaknesses

Via In-person Conversations

1. The **education system**, literacy, and poor support of teachers. Lack of resources, overcrowded classrooms, and inadequate facilities.
2. **Inadequate public transportation**, road conditions (potholes), inadequate parking, and poor aesthetics of "entry points" into the city.
3. **Lack of activities for the youth**, which leads to more gang-related activities and getting in trouble.
4. The limited **resources to address homelessness** and the resources to help build up **housing in their own community** without outside developers coming in and outpricing long-term residents.
5. **Low-paying jobs** and a lack of **job retention**



Danville's Top 9 Weaknesses

Respondents conveyed that their community is weak when it relates to a sense of security and the support needed to care for their whole well being. From the classroom to the recreation and entertainment, there is a longing for more investment into caring for the whole person.

Quality of Education:
Low quality of school food and water, school teams and clubs does not reflect the greater needs of the community, perception of racial discrimination in the learning environment.

Housing and Homelessness:
Lack of affordable housing options and a shortage of homes for people experiencing homelessness.

Discrimination and Racism:
Negative bias towards outsiders, Confederate flags do not promote a welcoming environment for residents, businesses, and visitors. Disinvestment and neglect in minority neighborhoods, lack of support, resources and representation of minorities in leadership positions relating to the arts, businesses.

Safety and Crime:
Incidence and perception of violent crimes, bullying, gangs, and general feelings of insecurity.

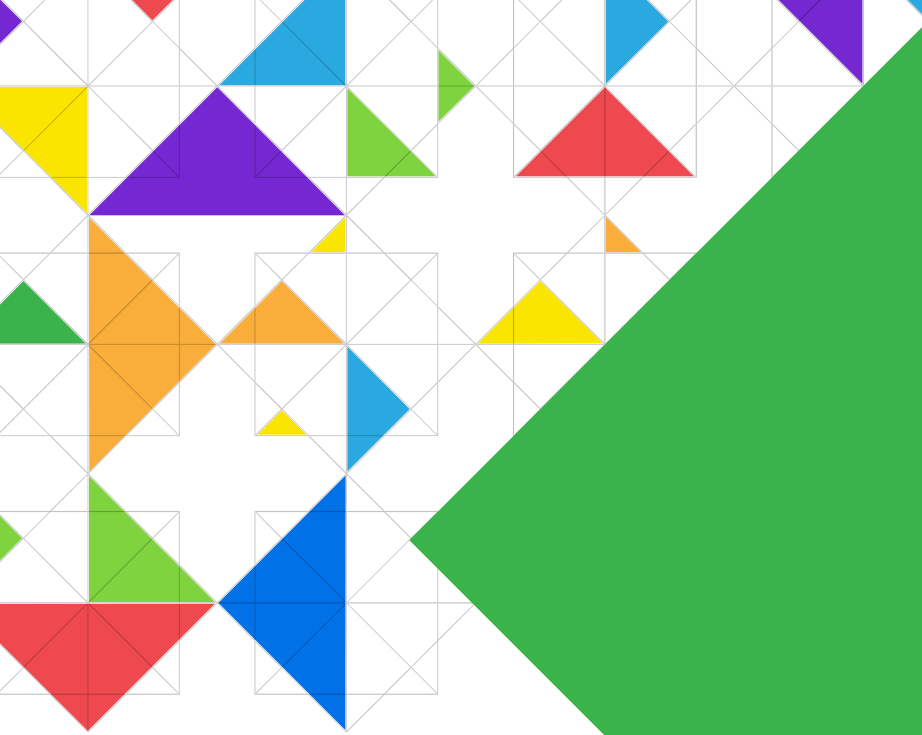
Recreation and Entertainment:
Need for more recreational activities, events, and entertainment options, particularly for children and youth. Also, a desire for better stores and restaurants.

Economic Development and Job Opportunities:
Low-paying jobs, limited quality job opportunities, and a lack of support for minority populations in terms of employment.

Infrastructure Maintenance:
Poor road conditions, better transportation options, and the need for broader access to internet and cable.

Engagement and Collaboration:
A lack of involvement and collaboration among residents and a need for better communication between the community and city officials

Healthcare Access:
Lack of equitable healthcare access, healthy food options, and accessible transportation to healthcare services

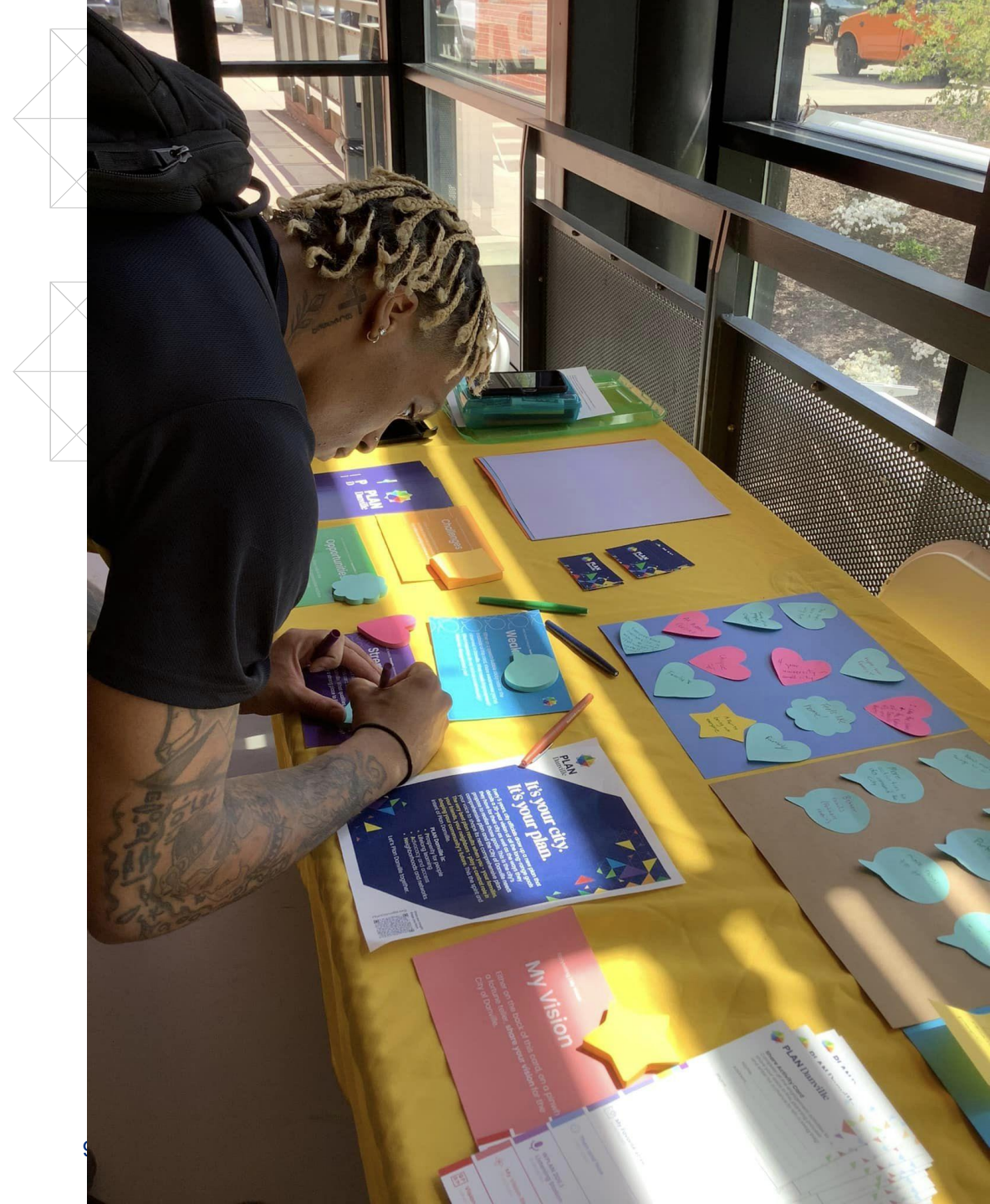
1. **Job creation and economic development**, with a focus on better-paying jobs and opportunities for **minorities** and **entrepreneurs**.

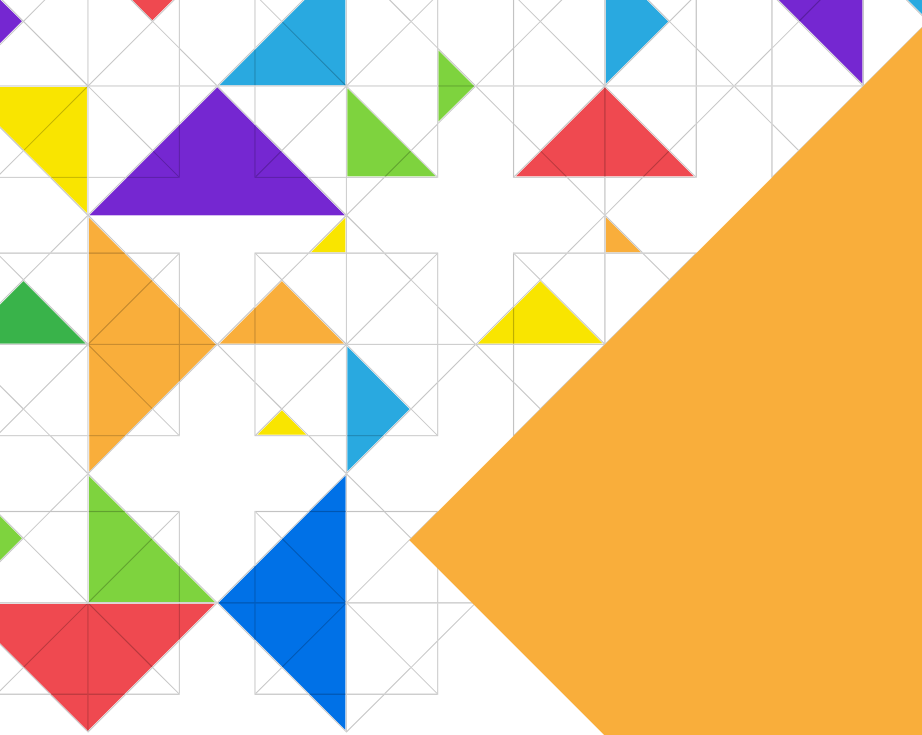

Danville's Challenges

Challenges can include internal issues, such as resource limitations, local inefficiencies, or cultural barriers, as well as external factors like market volatility, changing local preferences, and other obstacles that need to be overcome.

Challenges

Via the Online Survey

1. **Crime and Safety relating to the Casino:**

1. Concern for an increase in drug trafficking and gang activity
2. An increase in addiction and dependency within the City with the lack of resources
3. Concern with the ability of the city to handle the types of clientele and crimes
4. An increase in homelessness and panhandling due to higher tourism
5. More highly congested roads and dangerous intersections

2. **School System / Education:** Inadequate funding, resource inequities, teacher shortages, poor curriculum, and the necessity of prioritizing critical thinking, creativity, and collaboration

3. **Housing:** lack of available and affordable housing, elderly and entry-level housing, and the potential strain on housing with the influx of residents brought by the casino.

4. **Traffic:** increase in traffic that will come with the new casino and other development in the area, and this could lead to safety issues and delays for residents and visitors

Challenges

Via In-person Conversation

1. **Affordable Housing:** A lack of affordable housing and protection for rental tenants. The cost of rent is rising, making it difficult for single-parent working households to keep up with the cost of living.
2. **Community Engagement and Unity:** A lack of care and pride in neighborhoods, and a small-town mindset that hinders progress.
3. **Education and Workforce Development:** The poor school system and low-paying jobs drive away educated individuals, while businesses tend to hire staff from existing businesses rather than investing in new talent. There is also a lack of mentorship opportunities and entertainment options for youth.
4. **Transportation:** Barriers to transportation, particularly for seniors and low-income individuals. There is also a need for better traffic planning and schedules for Amtrak.
5. **Crime and Safety:** High crime, including gun violence, drug addiction, and gang activity.



Danville's Top 9 Challenges

Danville grapples with a multitude of challenges with a call for elevation in education for the region, increasing unity and race reconciliation, and the preservation of history while embracing change and fresh perspectives.

Education:

The quality of preschool and daycare, poor education, and a shortage of teachers.

Crime and Safety:

High crime rates, gun violence, and a lack of security in schools and the broader community.

Poverty and Resources:

Poverty, limited resources to support low-income individuals.

Housing:

Lack of affordable housing for all walks of life, protection for rental tenants, and neglect in particular neighborhoods.

Transportation:

Barriers to transportation, traffic flow problems, and the need for improved infrastructure and planning.

Historical Preservation:

Preserving and honoring history, converting negative attitudes toward change, and promoting fresh perspectives.

Workforce:

Limited employment opportunities, low-paying jobs, and a need for an educated workforce.

Community Unity:

Addressing race issues, promoting unity, and fostering community pride and care for each other and Danville.

Youth Engagement:

Providing entertainment and mentorship opportunities for youth, keeping them in the community, and bridging the gap between adults and young people.
